RULES

1. Exhibitors must fill in the Entry Form and return it to the Show Secretary, James Mclean 07919 256454 c/o Dundry Nurseries, Bamfurlong Lane, GL51 6SL. There will be a box for completed entry forms on the shop counter.
2. Entries can be left between **Wednesday 19th August and Wednesday 26th August** during Dundry Nurseries opening hours: Monday - Saturday 9am - 5pm; Sunday 10am - 4pm.
3. The Community Centre will be open for the staging of exhibits **from 7pm to 8.30pm on Friday 28th August and from 7.30am to 9am on the day of the show, Saturday 29th August.**
4. All Horticultural material, apart from the Floral Art Classes, must have been produced by the Exhibitor. All non-horticultural entries must be the bona-fide work of the Exhibitor.
5. Class cards obtainable from the Show Secretary prior to the staging, must be placed by each exhibit with the name of the Exhibitor face down.
6. An Exhibitor may make no more than two entries in any one class.
7. The decision of the Judges will be final.
8. All entries must remain completely staged until 4.30pm. Any exhibits remaining after 5pm will be disposed of.
9. The Organisers cannot be held responsible for any loss or damage caused to any exhibit.
10. There are no Class Entry Fees for either adult or child classes.
11. All prize money will be given out between 3pm and 4.30pm. Any uncollected money will pass to the Association Treasurer.
12. Any contingency not covered by these rules will be covered by the organisers and their decision will be final.
13. All Trophies are perpetual and remain the property of the Community Association. Trophies must be returned to the Show Secretary at least one month before the next Show. All holders of Trophies must take reasonable care of them.

15. Tomatoes - beefsteak - plate of 6
16. 3 Types of salad vegetable*
17. A collection of herbs - minimum of 5 sprigs - in a glass of water
18. A basket or trug of home grown flowers, fruit and vegetables
19. Rhubarb - 3 sticks - with leaves trimmed to 3"
20. Apples - 3 of any one variety
21. Pears - 3 of any one variety
22. Soft fruit - any one variety - plate of 5
23. Soft fruit - minimum of three varieties - plate of at least 15 fruits

**Collections - to be staged in a standard seed tray, dressed with parsley*

24. The heaviest onion - clean but not dressed
25. The heaviest pumpkin or squash

LEMON DRIZZLE LOAF RECIPE - CLASS 53

4oz/113g Margarine or Butter; 6oz/170g Caster Sugar;
6oz/170g Self Raising Flour; 1 tsp Baking Powder; 2 Large Eggs;
Zest of 1 Large Lemon; 2.5 fl oz/ 75ml Milk
For the syrup: 3 tablespoons Granulated Sugar; juice of 1 Large Lemon

Grease and line 2lb loaf tin; preheat oven to 180C/350F/Gas Mark 4
Use all in one method to beat ingredients together with electric whisk or food processor. Bake in prepared tin for 45-50 minutes.
Meanwhile dissolve sugar in lemon juice to make the syrup.
Cool cake in tin, whilst cooling prick all over with a skewer then pour over the syrup. Leave to cool completely in tin before turning out.
